The Guelph Community Foundation delivers \$512K to 11 community service organizations in Guelph and Wellington County through the Government of Canada's Community Services Recovery Fund

Guelph, Ontario – August 21, 2023

The Guelph Community Foundation is pleased to announce \$512,000 in funding to support 11 community service organizations in Guelph and Wellington County through the Government of Canada's Community Services Recovery Fund. The Community Services Recovery Fund is a one-time investment of \$400 million by the Government of Canada to help Community Service Organizations, charities, non-profits, and Indigenous governing bodies located in Canada. adapt, modernize and be better equipped to improve the efficacy, accessibility and sustainability of the community services that they provide through the pandemic recovery and beyond.

The Foundation received twenty-seven (27) applications to CSRF for funding totaling \$1,359,719 in requests. The funding provided was for the full amount of funding requested for almost all successful applications. From the 27 received, the Foundation has been able to invest in 11 organizations from its allocated funds.

The following projects are being supported in **Guelph and Wellington County**:

- \$ 100,000.00 was invested to fund Compass Community Services to upgrade its service systems;
- \$ 100,000.00 was invested to fund The Guelph Community Health Centre to modernize and improve its financial management system;
- \$ 54,406.00 was invested to fund Guelph Black Heritage Society to develop a comprehensive fundraising strategy;
- \$ 51,094.00 was invested to fund Guelph Film Festival to develop a strategic local growth strategy;
- \$ 42,500.00 was invested to fund West Village Community Development Cooperative to develop a cloud-based client and data management system;
- \$ 38,000.00 was invested to fund Food4Kids Guelph to redesign its fund development strategy;
- \$ 37,000.00 was invested to fund Ed Video Media Arts Centre to create specialized working spaces and to update its website;

- \$ 35,450.00 was invested to fund Guelph and District Multicultural Festival to develop organizational strategies;
- \$ 20,650.00 was invested to fund Royal City Mission to build and implement CRM software for donations and fundraising management;
- \$ 20,000.00 was invested to fund Michael House Pregnancy and Parenting Support Services to modernize and improve Michael House's website;
- \$ 12,900.00 was invested to fund Circle Home Charity Society to implement a refugee backlog management system.

Community service organizations are at the forefront of addressing communities' needs. Since the early phases of the COVID-19 pandemic, they have struggled with increased demand for their services, reduced revenues, declines in charitable giving due to the rising cost of living, and a greater need to make use of digital tools. Many organizations are struggling to recover and adapt their services to the changing needs of Guelph and Wellington. This investment is a much needed and unique opportunity for organizations as there typically is little funding available for these kinds of structural needs.

CSRF Quick Facts:

 The Community Services Recovery Fund is a \$400 million investment from the Government of Canada to support community service organizations, including charities, non-profits and Indigenous governing bodies, as they adapt their organizations for pandemic recovery.

- Now more than ever, community service organizations play a key role in addressing complex social problems faced by many communities across Canada.
- From the beginning of the COVID-19 pandemic, community service organizations across Canada have shown impressive stamina and creativity in their response to the diverse and increasingly challenging needs of their communities.
- The Community Services Recovery Fund responds to what community service organizations need right now and supports them as they adapt to the long-term impacts of the pandemic.
